For those of you that do not know, while in the program with us Taylor was, unfortunately, involved in an accident and continues to receive care related to those injuries. Taylor is now 15 years old and Marie shared her progress with us:



In the past 2 years Taylor has had 12 surgeries. She attends school every-day with a curriculum of several different therapy classes. Marie says "Music Therapy is her favorite".

Taylor continues to progress in alertness and responsiveness. Much like her mother, she is witty. Marie shared a story of how Taylor does not like to get eye drops and she closes her eyes and pretends to be asleep when she see the medical assistant coming.

I found it most endearing that after all this time, Marie considers all the people involved with Family Promise to be Family and shared that the relationships developed while she was in the program continue to encourage her and Taylor. Please continue to keep them in your prayers.
