Director's Corner

We have experienced so much in 10 years; a facility of 700 sq. ft. to 1700 sq. ft. to our new, large campus. Surviving through the Pandemic and serving more than 300 children in our program.

Children have graduated high school, married, become parents, served in the military, graduated college and began their careers. There have been a couple who have come in the program with their own children. 70% of the adults who have been in the program still reside in Houston County. Some moved for careers, marriage, and other life changes. We have had two parents pass away, one to Covid and one to cancer. One single dad married and lost his wife within a year. We lost two pastors and two precious dedicated Coordinators, Sandy and Ruth.

In respect to our partnering churches, some have grown and some have seen a decline in membership. We currently have 26 partnering churches but we have had a total of 37 congregations serve with us through the past 10 years. The number of businesses and civic organizations who support our program has tripled.

The economy has changed over this decade; rental rates have doubled for our clients. We have learned how to better serve our families "shelter, mental health and awareness, jobs/careers, and permanent housing".

Our Family Promise Family is a community of its own. Within our community our goal is to pour into the families that experience temporary homelessness so they may become productive citizens in Houston County. This is not an entitlement program. Our families work hard and save money in efforts to create stability for their children. Like every family we experience the cycle of life; many highs and lows, "The only thing constant is change".

We say Thank You to our Family Promise Community. Thank you for believing in us and allowing us the opportunity to serve homeless children in Houston County since 2013.

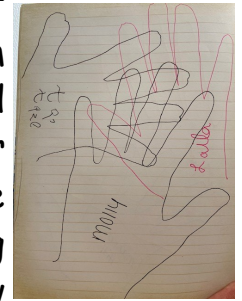
